Gale has been actively involved in mathematics education in the province of Saskatchewan since 1990. She began as a grades 7 – 12 mathematics (and arts education) teacher in Raymore and after 6 years moved to Rosetown as one of two high school mathematics teachers. In October of 1998, Gale began as the first full-time K-12 Mathematics Consultant at the Saskatchewan Ministry of Education, responsible for supporting teachers (and students) in all matters related to curriculum and instruction. After almost 12 years in that position, Gale left the Ministry of Education to obtain her PhD in Education, focusing on mathematics and worldviews. Gale Russell is now Associate Professor of Secondary Mathematics Education in the Faculty of Education at the University of Regina, and her dissertation has been published as a book: *Transreform Radical Humanism: A Mathematics Teaching Philosophy*.
