Gary Bosgoed, P.Eng. is the President & CEO of Bosgoed Project Consultants Ltd., a project management, consulting engineering and management consulting company headquartered in Alberta, with a practice across western Canada. With over thirty-six years of experience, he specializes in project leadership, community engagement and business advisory services.

Gary is a member of the Peepeekisis First Nation and has worked with over 120 First Nations. His experience includes educational projects, from elementary to post-secondary, as well as health, infrastructure, industrial, pipeline, telecommunications, institutional and commercial projects. BPC works with First Nations across Western Canada, and delivers most projects with unique consultation and engagement strategies.

Gary was recently VP Corporate Development at FT Service, a maintenance and turnaround company. Prior to that, he was the Senior Vice-President and General Manager of the WorleyParsons Edmonton office, leading over 2,600 personnel providing engineering, procurement and construction management services on projects around the world.

From 1992 to 2005, Gary was the founder and President of Bosgoed Project Consultants (BPC), a western Canadian consulting engineering, project management and design-build company that completed infrastructure, industrial, pipeline,

telecommunications, institutional and commercial projects for First Nations across Western Canada.

Mr. Bosgoed is also an active community volunteer, Past Chair of Alberta Capital Region United Way Campaign and Major Individual Gifts Chair, Co-chairing the Alberta TransCanada Trail Fundraising Committee, on the Norquest College Workforce Advisory Committee and Norquest College Indigenous Advisory Council. He also conceived of the Saskatchewan and Alberta Aboriginal Construction Careers Programs, which have provided construction jobs to over 17,000 indigenous people.

Gary is the recipient of numerous awards, including the University of Regina Distinguished Alumni Award, National Aboriginal Achievement Award in Business and Technology (now Indspire Award) and the Saskatchewan Centennial Medal. Gary is currently a Director of the Alberta Electric System Operator (AESO) and on the University of Regina Board of Governors. He was also founding Director of Circle Energy (CEN:TSX), a Calgary-based oil and gas exploration company and the Canadian Aboriginal Science and Engineering Association.
